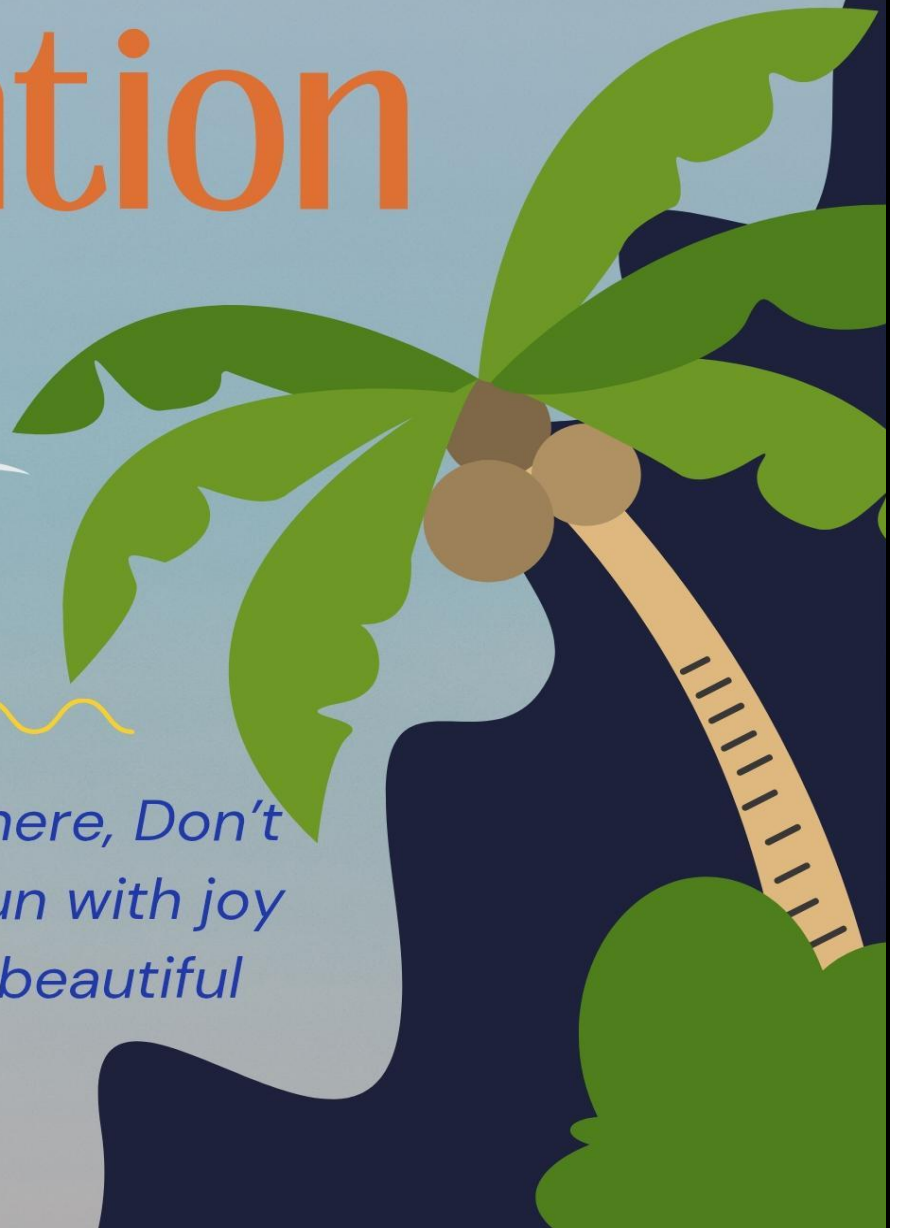




Happy Summer Vacation

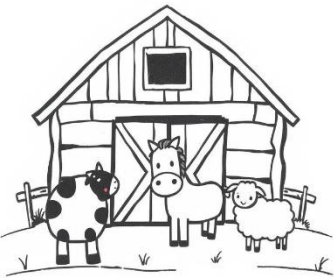
